



## Reaching Retirement-**Now What?**

ou've worked hard your whole life anticipating the day you could finally retire. Well, that day has arrived! But with it comes the realization that you'll need to carefully manage your assets so that your retirement savings will last.

#### **Review your portfolio regularly**

Traditional wisdom holds that retirees should value the safety of their principal above all else. For this reason, some people shift their investment portfolio to fixed-income investments, such as bonds and money market accounts, as they approach retirement. The problem with this approach is that you'll effectively lose purchasing power if the return on your investments doesn't keep up with inflation. While generally it makes sense for your portfolio to become progressively more conservative as you grow older, it may be wise to consider maintaining at least a portion of your portfolio in growth investments.

#### **Spend wisely**

Don't assume that you'll be able to live on the earnings generated by your investment portfolio and retirement accounts for the rest of your life. At some point, you'll probably have to start drawing on the principal. But you'll want to be careful not to spend too much too soon. This can be a great temptation, particularly early in retirement. A good guideline is to make sure your annual withdrawal rate isn't greater than 4% to 5% of your portfolio. (The appropriate percentage for you will depend on a number of factors, including the length of your payout period and your portfolio's asset allocation.) Remember that if you whittle away your principal too quickly, you may not be able to earn enough on the remaining principal to carry you through the later years.

#### Understand your retirement plan distribution options

Most pension plans pay benefits in the form of an annuity. If you're married you generally must choose between a higher retirement benefit paid over your lifetime, or a smaller benefit that continues to your spouse after your death. A financial professional can help you with this difficult, but important, decision. Other employer retirement plans like 401(k)s typically don't pay benefits as annuities; the distribution (and investment) options available to you may be limited. This may be important because if you're trying to stretch your savings, you'll want to withdraw money from your retirement accounts as slowly as possible. Doing so will conserve the principal balance and will also give those funds the chance to continue growing tax deferred during your retirement years. Consider whether it makes sense to roll your employer retirement account into a traditional IRA. IRAs usually offer greater withdrawal and investment flexibility than employer plans. A rollover to an IRA also allows you to consolidate your retirement assets.

#### Plan for required distributions

Keep in mind that you must generally begin taking minimum distributions from employer retirement plans and traditional IRAs when you reach age 73, whether you need them or not. Plan to spend these dollars first in retirement. If you own a Roth IRA, you aren't required to take any distributions during your lifetime. Your funds can continue to grow tax deferred, and qualified distributions will be tax free. Because of these unique tax benefits, it generally makes sense to withdraw funds from a Roth IRA last.

#### **Know your Social Security options**

You'll need to decide when to start receiving your Social Security retirement benefits. At normal retirement age (which varies from 65 to 67, depending on the year you were born), you can receive your full Social Security retirement benefit. You can elect to receive your Social Security retirement benefit as early

as age 62, but if you begin receiving your benefit before your normal retirement age, your benefit will be reduced. Conversely, if you delay retirement, you can increase your Social Security retirement benefit.

#### **Consider phasing**

For many workers, the sudden change from employee to retiree can be a difficult one. Some employers, especially those in the public sector, have begun offering "phased retirement" plans to address this problem. Phased retirement generally allows you to continue working on a part-time basis--you benefit by having a smoother transition from full-time employment to retirement, and your employer benefits by retaining the services of a talented employee. Some phased retirement plans even allow you to access all or part of your pension benefit while you work part time. Of course, to the extent you are able to support yourself with a salary, the less you'll need to dip into your retirement savings. Another advantage of delaying full retirement is that you can continue to build tax-deferred funds in your IRA or employersponsored retirement plan. Keep in mind, though, that you may be required to start taking minimum distributions from your qualified retirement plan or traditional IRA once you reach age 73. If you do continue to work, make sure you understand the consequences. Some pension plans base your retirement benefit on your final average pay. If you work part time, your pension benefit may be reduced because your pay has gone down. Remember, too, that income from a job may affect the amount of Social Security retirement benefit you receive if you are under normal retirement age. But once you reach normal retirement age, you can earn as much as you want without affecting your Social Security retirement benefit.

#### Facing a shortfall

What if you're nearing retirement and you determine that your retirement income may not be adequate to meet your retirement expenses? If retirement is just around the corner, you may need to drastically change your spending and saving habits. Saving even a little money can really add up if you do it consistently and earn a reasonable rate of return. And by making permanent changes to your spending habits, you'll find that your savings will last even longer. Start by preparing a budget to see where your money is going. By planning carefully, investing wisely, and spending thoughtfully, you can increase the likelihood that your retirement will be a financially secure one. •




Katie spoke proudly about her daughters. Maggie, the oldest, is 23 and resides in Davenport, Iowa after graduating from St.



An easy make-ahead dessert

#### **Ingredients:**

- 1 (18.25 ounce) package brownie + ingredients to make brownies
- 1 (14 ounce) can sweetened condensed milk
- ½ cup water
- 1 (3.9 ounce) package instant chocolate pudding mix
- ¾ cup milk
- 1 (3.9 ounce) package instant vanilla pudding mix
- 1 (16 ounce) container frozen whipped topping, thawed
- ¾ cup mini chocolate chips

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Make brownies according to package directions in the smallest recommended size pan. Do not over bake.
- 2. Cool brownies and cut into 1" pieces
- 3. Combine sweetened condensed milk, 1/2 cup water, and chocolate pudding mix in a large bowl; mix until smooth. Fold in 8 ounces whipped topping.
- 4. In a separate bowl, combine 3/4 milk with vanilla pudding mix, whisk until soft set. Fold in remaining 8 ounces whipped topping.

#### Assemble in trifle bowl:

- 1. Layer  $\frac{1}{2}$  of brownies, spread  $\frac{1}{2}$  chocolate topping over brownies then carefully spread ½ vanilla topping over chocolate, not mixing it together.
- 2. Repeat layers ending with vanilla topping. Sprinkle with mini chocolate chips.
- 3. Refrigerate for 6+ hours before serving.





## **South Central PA Soccer Academy**


he South Central PA Soccer Academy (SCPSA) is a program focused on player development, located in South Central PA. The SCPASA 07 Lions boys soccer team is a remarkable group of young men from various school districts in Adams County, including Bermudian Springs, Biglerville, Fairfield, and Gettysburg. They have an incredible chance to travel to Pirmasens, Germany from July 22-29, 2024, where they will participate in two "friendly" soccer matches to represent their communities and Adams County, PA.

The team consists of dedicated and hardworking players, and an opportunity like this is truly once-in-a-lifetime. But first, let's go back to the beginning. The club team was established in 2021, bringing together young men who have been playing soccer for most of their lives. Most of the players started with AYSO, progressing to other club teams in their respective communities, as well as their high school teams. The players who desired to continue playing at a more competitive level joined forces to form this team, under the leadership of Moffat Oduor, affectionately known as Mo.

The chance to play in Germany arose through their assistant coach, Daimen Michaels. Daimen grew up in a military family, which meant he moved around frequently during his childhood. He completed his high school education while his father was stationed in Germany, where he played for two soccer teams: F.K. Pirmasens and his high school team at Kaiserslautern

American High School. Daimen showcased exceptional talent during his high school years and was recruited, without even being seen in person, to play as a starting soccer player at Goldey-Beacom College in Wilmington, Delaware. After college, Daimen played for the Delaware Wizards for a season before the club disbanded. Daimen and his wife have two children, one of whom currently plays for the SCPASA 07 Lions team. It is through Daimen's connections with his former coaches and teammates in Germany that the incredible opportunity to play in Germany has presented itself for the team. Daimen speaks fondly of the team he helps coach, "I have coached the majority of these players on our current team since they were young and just started playing soccer. I have been my son Wyatt's only soccer coach since he started playing when he was little. I am proud of all of these athletes for their hard work, dedication to training and their development as players and as honorable and outstanding young men."

Coach Mo created the SCPASA in 2011 and has been coaching youth soccer in general since his college days in the late 1990s. Additionally, he served as an assistant coach for Lebanon Valley College Women's soccer at the collegiate level. As a former member of the Kenyan U-20 national team, he played soccer at the University of Charleston, WV before transferring to Furman University. Throughout his career, Mo played professionally in the USL league for Caroline Dynamo, Long Island Rough Riders, and Harrisburg City Islanders/Penn FC, where he was not only the



team captain but also won a national championship. Speaking of coaching the SCPSA specifically, Mo commented, "One of the most memorable moments with the SCPASA 07 Boys Lions team was when we came back from a 3-0 halftime deficit to tie the game 3-3 in the Championship game of the Potomac tournament against a team from New York. Despite the loss, it felt like a victory due to the opposing coach's disrespectful behavior at halftime." MO's focus is on "helping players learn from their experiences, maintain belief, and confidence. I take pride in leading teams to success and making a positive impact on my players' lives both on and off the field."

The SCPASA soccer club differs from other elite clubs in the area. They lack dedicated facilities and fields, using an outdoor field at a school in Biglerville and renting the All Star indoor complex during colder months. Their coaching staff is limited, with the club owner, Mo, as the main coach and a volunteer as the assistant

coach, Daimen. Despite the lack of sponsorships and visibility, their passion for the sport is evident in their achievements. They were champions in the 2022 Bethesda Premier Cup, the 2023 Challenger Invitational, and finalists in the 2023 Potomac Memorial Tournament. This is a significant accomplishment for a small team. The players are just as talented as those who pay hefty fees to play for sponsored teams.

Currently, the primary challenge hindering these young men from the opportunity to play in Germany is the financial burden of the trip. Many of the players

struggle to afford basic necessities such as uniforms and cleats for club-level play, making a trip to Germany unattainable for most of them. One player's mother, Beverly Michaels, is dedicated to ensuring that the players on this team have the chance to play in Germany. She stated, "Why should they miss out on this opportunity when they are so talented? That's why I have taken on fundraising as my mission for the next few months! Our goal is to raise \$40,000 to cover the costs of the roundtrip flight, accommodation (staying at a hostel in Pirmasens), and transportation while in Germany. Renting vans for a week and covering gasoline expenses is quite costly. These kids are committed to working for donations, but we are also reaching out to others for support. I firmly believe that it is through the generosity of others that this team's aspirations can become a reality." The team is utilizing social media and fundraising platforms to raise funds for the trip.

In May's issue, we will have an exciting lineup meeting this team's exceptional players. Among them are Wyatt Michaels, David Langman, Nick Auden, Luis Martinez, and Ciaran Phelan. One of the talented juniors, David from Gettysburg High School, expressed the significance of this team to him. He described it as a "second family" that the team has provided him. Join us next month as we explore the unity and camaraderie that this team embodies. •






## Special Olympics Athlete: Cindy Clapsaddle By Jill Rickle

ettysburg Little League (GLL) is getting ready for another exciting spring season! Two girls softball teams and more than13 baseball teams are on deck and eager to show their skills and teamwork. Mark your calendars for Opening Day on April 13th at the Rec Park with a rain date of April 20th. The day will start with a special ceremony including the national anthem and a lively parade featuring all the players and teams. Treat yourself to delicious concessions, hot dogs, and famous Mr. G's ice cream throughout the day-long event.

The ceremony and parade of teams will begin at 10 AM, followed by games on all fields. With a total of 200+ registered players, baseball teams include three T-Ball teams, three 8U teams, five 10U teams, one 12U team, one 50/70 team, and one Juniors level team. Softball has an 8U/10U hybrid team and a 14U/Juniors team. Get ready for an amazing season at GLL!

GLL, a non-profit organization dedicated to youth baseball and softball in Gettysburg, PA, and surrounding areas, was established in 1953. The following year, in 1954, GLL began playing on its own field at the Rec Park. Local businessmen, along with organizations like the Gettysburg Rotary, Moose, and Lions clubs, originally sponsored teams. Opening day festivities in the early days featured a parade from Lincoln Square to the Rec Park, complete with the school band, cars carrying the GLLpresident, and players proudly marching in their uniforms.

GLL has partnered with an umpire staffing company to provide umpires from the Adams/York -area. Last fall, they even had an umpire drive all the way from Delaware to officiate three consecutive games. That's dedication! Speaking of umpires, there is currently a shortage, and GLL is willing to step up and train local individuals who are interested in becoming umpires and providing the necessary resources to help someone pursue this opportunity. Last year, the 12U team participated in the Little League®international qualifiers for the Little League® World Series(LLWS) in Williamsport. Although they didn't make it out of district-play, GLL is determined to go further this spring. They have high hopes and are working hard to achieve those goals. Additionally, a 10U team had a fantastic performance in the Clarence Boyd Tournament, a regional tournament involving Little League® clubs from PA District 14. Of the six teams competing in District 14's West Division, the GLL team secured an impressive 2nd place finish. It's a remarkable achievement, and they couldn't be prouder of their young athletes. No team from PA District 14 has ever made it out of district level play in the LLWS competition. However, the players and coaches are optimistic and believe that this spring could be their breakthrough year.

Past GLL president Brent Cammauf will be this year's head coach for the 50/70 team and for one of the five 10U teams. He is excited and optimistic for the 2024 season. "Our number of players continues to go up and it's great to see the kids maintaining an interest in baseball. We're also seeing incredible support from our volunteer coaches who give their time and





talents to help promote skills development and sportsmanship. It's going to be another fantastic year for Little League!"

Coach Dustin Green grew up playing GLL and has been coaching his own son, Evan, since T-ball seven years ago. "I'm looking forward to helping the kids develop their physical and mental skills to further prepare them in their journeys in a sport I've loved since I was a kid." He added, "Teaching youth baseball is so much fun and is as much about teaching the kids life lessons as it is about how to play the game. Knowing that I make a positive impact on these kids and their families makes all of the time volunteering worth it. I can't think of a better way to spend the spring and summer."

Erin Hill, GLL secretary, announced, "We are excited to partner with local businesses to sponsor us for our 2024 season. Currently, we have around 25 sponsors at different levels and the number is growing! We are so thankful for our GLL sponsors because their financial support helps GLL keep player registration costs among the lowest in the Gettysburg-area." She also shared, "This year we are bringing back our concession stand to help raise funds for field improvements. It has been years since GLL had one at the Rec Park, and we are calling for community volunteers to help run it. We plan to open during games on Friday nights and Saturdays, offering hot dogs, snacks, Mr. G's ice cream, and more for everyone to enjoy while watching some baseball and softball games. We might also have concessions open in the evenings on weekdays, so you can grab a sports drink at the Rec Park!" •

Christine and Harvey Lee own nearly 55 acres in Germany Township near Littlestown in southeastern Adams County. Last July, the Land Conservancy of Adams County (LCAC) purchased a conservation easement on their property with the help of theUSDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and donations to the Land Conservancy from our supporters. NRCS contributed the majority of the funding through its Agricultural Conservation Easement Program, which provides up to 50% of appraised easement values to protect farmland. LCAC's requirement was to provide 10% of the value, allowing us to preserve this farm at significant discount, and with a substantial donation by the Lees.

The land owned by the Lees, which they purchased in 1987, consists of approximately 24 acres rented to a local farmer who rotates corn, soybean, and winter wheatplantings. Also within the property are woodlands, bottomlands and wetlands. In addition, the Lees have planted hundreds of trees, such as eastern black walnut and sycamore, on nearly 14 acres of environmentally sensitive riparian areas through the Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP), another NRCS program withgoals to enhance water quality, reduce erosion, and restore wildlife habitat.

"Piney Creek [within the Monocacy/Potomac watershed] runs through our land," they said. A major influence guiding their preservation efforts over the years has been their commitment to doing their part to protect that watershed. "We've been in CREP for about 20 years. The land between the road front and Piney Creek formerly was bare. But now it contains a healthy forest we planted to protect that stream." They concluded, "We joined LCAC due to our personal commitment to rural preservation." •



## Printers:

## Choosing the Right One



inding the right printer to meet your personal needs can be a challenge.

There are so many options available that it can be hard to know what will work best for you. There are 3 major factors that users can consider when purchasing a printer: cost, features, and purpose.

#### **Printer Costs**

You may have noticed that new printers are often less expensive than replacing the ink or toner they use. This is because printer manufacturers rely heavily on ink and toner sales to boost profits while typically taking a loss on printer sales. It might be tempting to go out and buy a new printer when you run out of ink, but new printers usually contain starter cartridges that are only partially filled.

There are three major types of consumer printers: inkjet printers, laser printers, and eco-tank printers.

- Inkjet printers contain one or more colors plus black cartridges, depending on photo printing quality. Inkjet printers tend to have the most expensive ink averaging \$35 per cartridge.
- Laser printers can be either monochrome or color and contain a single black toner or black and color toners. Toner has a higher upfront cost, but you get 100% more prints out of a single toner which can range from 1,000 to 3,000 or more versus inkjet cartridges which only yield between 250 and 300 pages.

· Eco-tank printers are newer and are becoming more popular due to their low cost and more eco-friendly options, hence the name. Unlike inkjet printers which use pre-filled ink cartridges, users refill their eco-tank printers with refill bottles which can save on ink. With the eco-tank printers, you are only purchasing the colors that you need. You are not replacing the cartridges themselves but instead only the ink stored inside the printer tank.

When considering the cost of your printer, always look at the cost of the ink or toner your device is compatible with before you purchase your equipment. Printer manufacturers encourage users to use genuine ink cartridges and toners. Choosing to use remanufactured cartridges can result in subpar printing and in some cases can damage your machine. If having good quality prints is important to you, stick with the name-brand ink cartridges made by the manufacturer. If you are just printing personal documents, are willing to take the risk, and don't care a whole lot

about the quality, you may be able to get away with using remanufactured or refilled OEM (original equipment manufacturer) cartridges.

#### **Printer Features**

When purchasing a new printer consider all the features that you might utilize. First, consider if you will be using your printer on a wireless network or hardwired into your device's USB. Once you know what type of connection you need you can consider whether you will need to print in black and white or if you want to be able to print in color. If you only require black, a monochrome printer may be a more affordable and reliable option for your needs. Some printers can print duplex or on both sides of the paper. If you plan to purchase a scanner built into your printer, consider whether you want a document feeder that can scan multiple pages without needing to lay each page on a scanner flatbed. Some scanners can

scan both sides of an image whereas other scanners only scan one side at a time requiring the user to flip the page for double-sided scanning. You might want specific scanning and printing features such as scanning to enlarge or print legalsize documents.

#### **Printing Purpose**

Are you planning to use your printer for everyday printing, or do you need photoquality images? Do you want higherquality prints or faster print times? A laser printer will print out copies faster but won't offer as high-quality prints as inkjet or eco-tank printers. If you print less often you may want to opt for a laser printer because the ink doesn't dry up or clog like an inkjet or eco-tank printer can from infrequent use.

Making an informed decision about your printer purchase will ensure you are buying a printer that suits your specific needs. •
