Beware:

Harmful Algae Blooms May Harm Pets

IF YOU HAVE A POND IN YOUR BACKYARD, hike with your dog in areas where there are standing bodies of water or allow your dog to swim in ponds or lakes, beware of a potential threat in the water: toxic algae. Harmful Algal Blooms (HAB) are found across the United States, including Pennsylvania. Pinchot State Park and Lake Erie have suspended swimming several times this summer due to harmful algal blooms. HAB are more common in shallow ponds or lakes receiving runoff from farmland and occur when certain types of blue-green algae containing cyanobacteria produce toxins which can be deadly to fish, livestock and pets as well as to wildlife and people. Algal blooms can occur any time of year, but are more prevalent in the summer months.

If you see thick, red or bright green clumps or mats of floating algae sometimes looking like spilled green paint or pea soup on the surface of a lake or pond, don't allow pets to drink or swim in the water.

Tips for avoiding HAB affected waters:

- Check for advisories and avoid the water when warnings prohibiting swimming are posted.
- Do not enter the water if it is discolored, smells bad, or has foam or scum on the surface
- Do not fish, boat, swim, or play water sports when harmful algae are present.
- Keep pets out of the water and do not let pets drink lake or pond water! Dried algal blooms may also still contain toxins so check the shore for evidence and avoid the area if dried algae are present.

- If you or your pet are exposed, rinse your pet and/or your skin with clean water as soon as possible and monitor for symptoms of toxin exposure (see symptoms below).
- · When in doubt, stay out!

The cyanobacteria within the algae can produce various toxins affecting the liver, nerves or skin. If not treated, exposure to these toxins can be fatal. Dogs are more susceptible than people and can quickly become ill or even die.

Symptoms which may occur within as little as 30 minutes or up to a few days after exposure include:

- 1. Vomiting, diarrhea, loss of appetite
- 2. Staggering, seizures, paralysis, confusion
- 3. Difficulty breathing, drooling, jaundice of the eyes or gums, decreased urine output
- 4. Skin rash or hives
- 5. In people, all of the above plus headache, fever, lethargy, dizziness

If you think your dog may have been swimming in water affected by HAB, eating algae, or drinking from a pond or lake in which harmful algae are present or your dog is displaying any of the signs of toxic algae exposure, seek veterinary help immediately or contact pet poison control (ASPCA Animal Poison at 1-888-426-4435 or the Pet Poison Helpline at 1-855-764-7661). Be aware of the dangers of HAB and be safe this summer!

Long before the doors open and the first guests arrive, the dedicated staff and technical crew begin their day, often working a full eight-hour shift (or longer) to prepare every aspect of the event. From setting up lighting, sound, and stage elements, to ensuring all technical systems are in perfect working order, every task is carefully executed to guarantee a seamless experience for their patrons.

However, the work doesn't end when the final curtain falls. Once the performance concludes, the team transitions into another several hours of intense activity—tearing down equipment, packing up gear, and ensuring the space is cleaned and restored to its original state. It's a process that demands attention to detail, precision, and a collective effort from everyone involved to make sure the next event can go off without a hitch.

Anita clarifies, "So, for a normal event, we are working a 12-14 hour day, and our volunteer ushers are helping for about four hours. A weekend dance competition could have us on-site for 36 hours over three days. Our team shares meals, jokes, family stories and event experiences. We commiserate when we're tired, encourage each





Down the Hall Studios: Where Creativity Lives in Red Lion

TUCKED INSIDE THE CHARMING

HALLS of a former middle school in Red Lion, a vibrant creative hub is bringing photography, community, and artistic inspiration under one roof. Down the Hall Studios, founded by professional opera singer-turned-arts entrepreneur Xela (pronounced SHAY-la) Pinkerton, is more than just a photography studio—it's a gathering place for makers, dreamers, musicians, and families alike.

Opening its doors in September 2024, Down the Hall Studios is already redefining what it means to be a local arts center. That playful spirit, paired with the building's nostalgic architecture, gives the space a warmth you can feel as soon as you walk in.

With future plans to expand—including the addition of a podcast studio—Xela and her team are just getting started. "We're building a creative home not just for Red Lion, but for anyone seeking to explore, express, and connect," she says.

So whether you're booking a portrait session, signing your child up for voice lessons, or just looking for a place to feel inspired—Down the Hall Studios welcomes you. Creativity lives here. And there's always something magical waiting... just down the hall.

Cinnamon Swirl Zucchini Bread

By Katie Burtt of Burtt Baking Co.

- 11/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. baking soda
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp. ground nutmeg
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup packed light or dark brown sugar
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 large egg
- · 2 tsp vanilla
- 1 cup shredded zucchini (about 1 medium)

For the cinnamon swirl:

- 1/3 cup granulated sugar
- 1 T. cinnamon



Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 9"x5" loaf pan.

Mix together the swirl ingredients in a small bowl and set aside.

Whisk the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, and nutmeg together in a large bowl until thoroughly combined. Set aside. In a medium bowl, whisk the oil, brown sugar, granulated sugar, egg, vanilla and zucchini together until combined. Pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients. Gently stir until just combined: do not overmix. Batter will be semi-thick.

Spread half of the batter into the prepared pan. Sprinkle half of the swirl mixture evenly over the surface. Top with the remaining batter and sprinkle the top with the remaining swirl ingredients. Bake for 45-55 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. (You can cover your loaf with foil if it's browning too quickly).

Allow to cool before slicing. Store bread at room temperature for up to 3-4 days or in the refrigerator for up to 1 week.




Community Garden & Beekeeping Program at Marge Goodfellow Park - New Freedom, PA

NEW FREEDOM HERITAGE is a volunteer group whose mission is to preserve New Freedom's heritage by fostering community relationships to enhance and preserve the town's cultural character. Our mission statement is "to preserve our history for future generations through written, oral, and historical items depicting New Freedom Heritage".

This group sponsors the Heritage Museum of New Freedom, located at 22 Railroad Avenue next to Freedom Green Community Park in the center of town that features a beautiful gazebo. The museum serves to present New Freedom's history and preserve some of our town's artifacts. Items you can see at the museum include artifacts from New Freedom High School, the baseball team, long standing businesses which helped to build up the community of New Freedom, preserved pictures of local buildings and the railroad, as well as other fun and interesting items. The museum is open the first and third Sunday of each month from 1-4pm. Admission is free, but gifts are gladly accepted.

New Freedom Heritage sponsors several community events such as New Freedom Fest which will be held Saturday, September 20, 2025, 10AM -5PM. The fest is an old-time "festival of small town life" and includes live entertainment, arts and crafts vendors, pony rides, food trucks, pet parade, kid games, pumpkin painting, and much more - all centered around the beautiful and historic town of New Freedom, Pennsylvania.

The Northern Central Railway will have 20-minute round trip rides to Railroad using their historic 1959 PRR GP9 diesel locomotive following the route of the original Northern Central Railroad through the scenic Heritage Rail Trail County Park. Northern Central Railway is an excursion railroad that makes time travel possible! The historic attraction, with a replica 1860's steam locomotive and their diesel engine, hosts excursions that educate, entertain, and enlighten. The railway museum will also be open as part of the fun at the fest and NCR will also be hosting bingo games in their educational building off Main Street.

Vortex Brewing will be hosting an Oktoberfest tent and pairing with a local winery to add to the festivities. Music and food will be available in this tent.

A Workplace Comedy That Still Punches the Clock

AS THE 75TH ANNIVERSARY of The Totem Pole Playhouse's operation continues, Dolly Parton's Broadway hit, 9 to 5, is a smashing success. The show ran through July 6 and with a cast of twenty-five local and extraordinarily talented actors and crew.

First premiering as a hit film in 1980, the story follows the antics of a business wherein the culture is less than ideal, and not so subtly depicts a bit of reality for the times. The show represented working women's struggles in business and society at the time.

Three smart, capable, female employees (including one new hire) find themselves under the supervision of a chauvinistic boss within a toxic culture. Determined to implement change, they take matters into their own hands to teach their incorrigible boss a lesson. The result is a cultural redirection which leads to much-needed employee empowerment.

However, some not so creative accounting practices are uncovered when the three co-conspirators physically remove the incorrigible boss from the organization in hopes that he will learn the error of his ways. In the end, and on their own, the women go on to create an empowering, more successful business model through cultural change resulting in greater employee satisfaction.

The serious, often exaggerated, and humorous jabs against female employees is not lost in the performance. However, the much needed and sometimes satiric solutions initiated by the three women result in a changed culture, improved employee satisfaction, as well as a stronger bottom line.

To say that this show is dynamic is a vast understatement. The rapid set changes, palpable high energy, enlivening music, powerhouse vocals, and professional acting combine to evoke emotion (and especially for those of us who worked during that era - empathy).

"9 to 5 is the show our community has been asking for", says producing Artistic Director Ryan B. Gibbs. "It's smart, it's hilarious, and full of joy."
