

When Is It Time To Purchase New Hearing Aids?

question that gets asked by hearing aid wearers a lot is how often they should get new aids. There are several factors that play into this decision. The decision to purchase new aids isn't always driven by a wearer's current aids malfunctioning. Broken hearing aids can always be repaired and this is usually the most cost efficient option a

person chooses. There are several all-make repair labs across the country that keep parts on hand for years and years.

These days, Rita isn't just transforming smiles—she's stepping into a whole new chapter of life that includes horsepower, sunsets on the water, and a much-anticipated new role: grandparent.





From Hanover to the Apocalypse:

Stathis El Greco Turns a Daily Commute into a Gripping Survival Tale BY JILL RICKLE



hat if the world as you knew it shut down—no phones, no power, no help—and all that stood between you and your family was 45 miles of danger? For Hanover resident Stathis El Greco, that chilling "what if" turned into 45 Miles of Hell, a heart-pounding debut novel that's gaining fans far beyond our local area.

But this isn't just a story about the end of the world—it's also the beginning of an unexpected journey for the local resident.

Though he was born in York and spent part of his childhood in Greece, Stathis has called Hanover home since 2013. He says it's the mix of cultures—Greek resilience and small-town grit—that shaped both him personally and as a storyteller.

"Growing up in Greece, I saw people overcome a lot with very little," Stathis shares. "That shaped how I see strength, loyalty, and what it means to survive." English isn't even his first language—he started writing the book in Greek, then switched to English halfway through. That bold move didn't just improve his writing; it made his voice sharper and more honest. You can feel that in every page.

The idea for 45 Miles of Hell came during the early days of COVID. While most of us were figuring out sourdough starters or bingeing Netflix, Stathis started writing a survival story that wouldn't let go of him.

He imagined a man stuck in a dark, crumbling city after an electromagnetic pulse wipes out the power grid—and the long, dangerous road back home to his family. That story, inspired by Stathis' own daily commute, became his obsession.

"I finished the first chapter and thought, 'Damn... this might actually be something," he recalls.

For five years, he wrote quietly—treating the story more like a personal journal than a public project. It wasn't until this spring that he finally shared the finished manuscript with his wife, Tina, whose excitement helped turn his private passion into a published novel.

What makes 45 Miles of Hell so gripping isn't just the drama—it's the realism. Stathis has spent years studying survival guides, preparedness strategies, and real-world crisis scenarios. Every decision his characters make is grounded in real tactics, not Hollywood fluff.

Even better, much of the book's setting is drawn directly from our own backyards. Hanover-area readers will recognize familiar roads,



towns, and landscapes throughout the journey. "I didn't want this to feel like just another survival story," Stathis says. "I wanted it to feel like it could happen right here. Because honestly, it could."

Part of what gives Stathis' writing its edge is his own lifestyle. He trains in Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu, Muay Thai, and mixed martial arts—often hitting the gym in the middle of the night. He also hikes regularly and recently launched a YouTube channel where he shares preparedness tips and survival insights.

That hands-on experience shines through in the action scenes. You're not just reading about survival—you feel it.

Reader response to 45 Miles of Hell has been powerful—and surprisingly emotional. "I've had people message me saying it made them hug their family

tighter," Stathis says. "That's the best compliment I could get." More than just thrilling fiction, the book taps into something deeply human: the will to fight for the people we love, even when the world falls apart.

The story's not over yet. Stathis is deep into the sequel, promising even more intensity and emotional depth. He envisions a series spanning three or four books—and he's already outlining a separate, darker project with a psychological twist (and maybe even zombies).



But no matter how far his stories stretch, Stathis remains grounded here in Hanover. "I'd love to connect more with the local community," he says. "If anyone wants to set up a reading, signing, or event—I'm all in."



As Windows 10 reaches its tenth anniversary, Microsoft is ushering in the end of its support lifecycle, prompting users to consider their next move in a rapidly shifting digital environment. Breaking Barriers and Building Community:

Stephanie Moore Brings Adaptive Sports to the Forefront in Hanover

hen Stephanie Moore moved to Hanover in 2022, she brought a bold vision for change. A lifelong athlete with an unstoppable spirit, Stephanie is on a mission to ignite the adaptive sports movement here in our community.

Originally from Maryland, Stephanie's athletic journey began in childhood,

where she played alongside able-bodied peers. But by high school, her opportunities to compete were taken away-"out of fear of injury," she explains. So she stepped back from sports entirely. It wasn't until decades later, at the age of 40, that she decided to reclaim her athletic identity. What started as a quest for better health quickly turned into something bigger.

"I attended an adaptive sports fair and found out about all kinds of adaptive sports," she recalls. "I tried many-cycling, basketball,



tennis, field hockey, rowing, and boxing." While boxing quickly became her passion, it was wheelchair tennis that she ultimately stuck with. "I love playing tennis and teaching others how to play," Stephanie says. And she's not just talking about playing casually-this year, she's participating in a wheelchair tennis demonstration at none other than the U.S. Open.

But perhaps the most groundbreaking part of her journey so far came in the boxing ring. Stephanie made history in 2023 with the

first-ever adaptive boxing exhibition match in the United States, followed by a second one in 2024. The sport is now on its way toward becoming a Paralympic event, thanks in part to the work of Stephanie's coach and community.

Still, her heart is set on sparking change right here in Hanover. "There are no adaptive sports in Hanover," she states bluntly. The nearest programs are hours away-in Chester County or Philadelphia. But rather than see this as a barrier, Stephanie sees opportunity. "We need coaches—those who already know the sports and how to teach them. I'm more than willing to meet with anyone interested in learning how to coach adaptively."

Stephanie currently trains at the Junior Tennis Champions Center in College Park, Maryland, where she puts in rigorous weekly sessions. At home, she supplements her training with cardio, strength training, and hand-eye coordination drills. It's a disciplined lifestyle that's brought confidence, purpose, and a deep connection with a network of adaptive athletes across the country. "They are the community I never knew I needed," she says.

But that community could, and should, exist here too. Stephanie dreams of launching adaptive tennis and boxing programs in Hanover-two sports that are already equipped with potential facilities and coaches in the area. "Boxing is one of the oldest Olympic sports. There's no reason it shouldn't be a Paralympic sport too. And I believe Hanover could help lead the charge."

Stephanie has a clear message for anyone hesitant to try adaptive sports: "If I can start over at 40, anyone can. Development takes time. Just get in there and do your best."

Her ultimate hope? That the Hanover community will step up and embrace adaptive athletics—not just as a feel-good initiative, but as an essential, inclusive part of our local sports culture. "Get behind this endeavor," she urges. "There are athletes here who would benefit. We just need to get it started."



Easy Lentil Soup

INGREDIENTS

- 6 cups low sodium, fat-free chicken broth
- 114-oz can fire-roasted tomatoes
- 1½ cups red lentils
- ½ cup chopped onion (add more if you like onion!)
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 1 tbsp crushed garlic (optional)

INSTRUCTIONS

- Place all the ingredients in a soup pot and bring to a boil.
- Reduce the heat, cover and simmer for about 25 more minutes, until you see that the lentils are soft and falling apart.
- Let the mixture cool and, if you like food on the spicier side, add some crushed red pepper flakes.
- **4.** Use a handheld immersion blender to puree it as much as you like. More for a smooth-and-creamy soup, less if you like texture.
- **5.** Enjoy!

A simple name with an astonishing outreach, Servants serves residents in three contiguous counties: York, Lancaster, and Adams with services designed to provide residents with Healthy Homes. Safer Homes, and as a result, Healthier Lives.

Now celebrating its 25th Anniversary, Servants CEO, Trent Davis, says "Together we've seen the joy of older adults who can move freely in their homes after years of confinement, the relief of parents knowing their children are safe, and the renewed pride of families in their homes."

Servants is more than a home repair organization—it is a crusade of compassion, faith, and transformation. Through their work in providing critical home repairs, staff along with volunteers change lives through emotional and spiritual support to those in crisis as well.

My tour of the massive 16,000 square foot warehouse, adjacent to their offices, included lumber storage, painting supplies, flooring, and so much more at the ready to not only change homes but more importantly, to build relationships, transform lives, provide hope, and build stronger communities!

Mary's Story

Living with and caring for her aging mother, Mary's home had become unsafe. A steep and crumbling wheelchair ramp made it difficult for her mother to get outside, the floors sagged dangerously, plumbing



issues piled on stress, and she could barely manage.

That is when a team from Servants stepped in. Their mission is not just about fixing houses - it is about restoring hope. The team rebuilt the wheelchair ramp.

repaired plumbing issues, and secured weakened floors. More than that, they brought care, compassion, and dignity.

"They didn't just fix things, said Mary - they saw me and ensured that I would not have to carry this situation alone anymore." Her story is one of many unfolding across York, Lancaster, and Adams Counties where aging homes and limited incomes leave too many neighbors stuck in unsafe living conditions.

Veterans Affairs and advocacy organizations, "lifting the dignity of homeowners," according to Todd Spahr, Director of Operations and Impact with Servants. Further. these vital relationships go a long way in keeping people out of Emergency Centers. "Volunteers and Project Managers take great pride in the work they do", according to Todd. For them, it is not just a matter of replacing stairs or a deck...it is about changing and empowering people's lives.



Process for Projects

In 2024 alone, and with a staff of only 11 and 550 volunteers, Servants made a staggering 500 repairs in 189 homes. Here is how the process works. A simple phone call from a homeowner results in a conversation with a staff member at Servants who conducts a brief phone assessment. Following this, a member of the staff visits the home to assess the need

(oftentimes there are more needs than originally requested). A work plan is then developed which includes a budget for materials, staffing/volunteer requirements, and a schedule for the homeowner's approval. Currently, requests focus on the needs of homeowners in York, Lancaster, and Adams Counties. And speaking of volunteers, the youngest is 8 years old and the eldest is 83 years young!

Project managers are experienced professionals in their respective fields and oversee projects from start to finish. They rely on an algorithm to prioritize projects. Each year during Fire Prevention Week, we're reminded that simple habits can make a big difference in keeping our homes and families safe. Use this checklist to reduce fire risksespecially with today's common devices powered by lithium-ion batteries. Keep these easy reminders handy all year long!

Home Safety Checklist

- · Test smoke alarms monthly
- Replace smoke alarm batteries yearly
- Plan and practice two escape routes from every room
- · Charge lithium-ion batteries only with manufacturer-approved chargers
- Keep batteries away from flammable items when charging
- Dispose of damaged or swollen batteries safely
- Never leave cooking unattended
- Keep flammable items away from stovetops and heaters
- Maintain a 3-foot "safe zone" around heaters and fireplaces
- Use sturdy candle holders and extinguish candles before leaving room
