

### What Rising Interest Rates Realy Mean for Buyers and Sellers

 Affordability has shifted: Buyers' purchasing power drops as rates rise, meaning someone who could afford your price point last year may now be looking lower. According to the Realtor Association of York and Adams County (RAYAC) our

MLS statistics show, for example, that the price of homes has increased by 6% in the Gettysburg School District from the first half (January- June) of 2024 to the first half of 2025. Yet, the amount of sales has decreased between the same two time periods by 12%. For Hanover/South Western School districts, prices has increased 11% (2024-2025), yet the amount of sales have not decrease.

- Longer listing times: Homes aren't selling quite as fast and pricing strategy matters more than ever. Today's buyers are more cautious and expect value. The average days on market (DOM) for York and Adams County over the past 3 months are approximately 22 days for homes listed between \$200,000 and \$500,000.
- Motivated buyers are still out there: People still move for jobs, family, lifestyle, and life changes. A well-priced, well-presented home will still sell — just maybe not with 10 offers over asking. All homes sell, if the pricing is accurate!
- Bottom line for sellers: Be realistic, flexible, and prepared to negotiate. Price strategically from the start, highlight your home's unique features, and lean on your agent to guide the process with up-to-date market insights.

#### What It Means for the Market Overall

We're moving away from the ultra-fast, ultra-competitive market of the past few years into something more balanced. And that's not necessarily a bad thing.

- More realistic expectations on both sides







# Navigating the End of Windows 10 Support

As Windows 10 reaches its tenth anniversary, Microsoft is ushering in the end of its support lifecycle, prompting users to consider their next move in a rapidly shifting digital environment. For some, Microsoft's Extended Security Updates (ESR) may offer a temporary safety net; for others, upgrading hardware to meet Windows 11 requirements or investing in a new device could be the more practical path forward. Whether your priorities lie in performance, security, or long-term compatibility, this article will help guide you through the available options and equip you to make a decision that fits your unique

### Why is support for Windows 10 ending?

Microsoft is ending support for Windows 10 because it has reached the end of its planned life—10 years after its release. This means it will no longer get updates that fix bugs or protect against security threats, making continued use risky. Microsoft is focusing on newer systems like Windows 11, which are built to handle today's technology and offer stronger security features. If you're still using Windows 10, now's the time to look at your options and decide what works best for you.

#### **Extended Security Updates (ESU)**

give users a paid way to continue receiving critical security updates for up to three years after Windows 10 support ends. Users can opt in when attempting to run Windows Updateif eligible, a prompt will appear offering extended updates. However, if your device is behind on updates or struggling to complete them, you may not see this option. It's important to note that ESU pricing for individual users increases each year: starting at \$30 in the first year, doubling annually, and ending after three years. After that, users will need to upgrade to Windows 11 or move to another supported operating system to stay protected.

Upgrading hardware is only a viable

option if your device can support the minimum system requirements for Windows 11. This includes a compatible CPU, at least 4 GB of RAM, and 64 GB of storage—though more is recommended for better performance. Most systems built in the last five years already meet these standards, but older devices may require hardware upgrades or full replacement to qualify.

Before upgrading hardware, it's important to assess the current condition of your device. If components are already showing signs of failure—such as frequent crashes, overheating, or slow performance—attempting an upgrade may not be worth the risk. Installing new parts into a failing system can lead to compatibility issues, wasted costs, or even complete system failure. In some cases, aging hardware may not support newer components reliably, and the effort to upgrade could result in more downtime and frustration than simply replacing the device. A thorough evaluation of your system's health can help you decide whether an upgrade is feasible or if replacement is the safer, more costeffective path.

Replacing your device is often the most straightforward path forward when it comes to transitioning from Windows 10—especially if your current system is aging, incompatible with Windows 11, or already showing signs of wear. - around heaters and fireplaces Use sturdy candle holders and extinguish candles before leaving room

**RESIDENT FEATURE** From Dentistry to Driving Dreams: How Dr. Rita Tempel is **Embracing Life, Smiles, and the Open Road**

Rita Tempel has always had a talent for changing lives—one smile at a time. As the founder of Gettysburg Smiles, she's built a reputation for meticulous artistry in dentistry, a deep sense of patient care, and a career grounded in excellence. But if you think that's where the story ends, think again.

These days, Rita isn't just transforming smiles—she's stepping into a whole new chapter of life that includes horsepower, sunsets on the water, and a much-anticipated new role: grandparent.

'I'm entering a season that's all about joy, fun, and welcoming the next generation," Rita says, her smile radiating the same confidence and contentment she inspires in others every day. "I'm going to be a Nonna that's Italian for grandmother!" she beams. "I can't wait!"

After building her practice from scratch, raising two sons, and achieving impressive professional milestones many only dream of, Rita is intentionally carving out space for fun and adventure. She's living proof that it's never too late to start fresh-or go fast.

These days, if you don't catch her at her beautiful dental office on York Road, you might find her out on the water, behind the wheel of her 2024 Corvette C8 Z51 (affectionately known as "Stetson"), or on the road to her next fishing spot.

Rita's story begins in the suburbs of Reading, Pennsylvania, where she grew up as the daughter of immigrants who came to America with very little and worked hard for every opportunity. Her mother came from Germany and her father from Italy. They met while attending night school to learn English.

"They came here with almost nothing, but they worked hard, saved, and built a life," Rita says. Her father worked as an electrician at Dana Corporation, while her mother was a waitress. From them, she inherited her strong work ethic and deep appreciation for resilience—qualities that would carry her far.

She earned her Bachelor of Science from Albright College and went on to receive her Doctorate of Dental Surgery from the University of Maryland's Dental School in 1993. From there, she served in the U.S. Army, first at Fort Meade in Maryland and later at Fort Carson in Colorado. treating soldiers and developing her clinical skills.

After her military service, she balanced part-time private practice work while raising her two sons. In 2005, she took a leap of faith. Renting one operatory in another dentist's building in Gettysburg, she launched her own practice from scratch.

"It was just me and my assistant, Megan," Rita recalls. "We did it all ourselves and slowly added more team members as the practice grew. She's still with me today, and I feel incredibly lucky to have had someone so loyal and talented by my side from the very beginning."


"That one room quickly turned into two, and as we continued to grow, I realized I needed a space of my own," Rita says. Within a year, she purchased and completely renovated a property at 2018 York Road, transforming it into a modern dental office known

for its beautiful cosmetic work and comprehensive care.

Over the years, Rita has cultivated a practice defined by excellence, integrity, and a personal touch. Her approach is simple: treat patients the way she would want to be treated. "I offer my patients what I'd want in my own mouth," she explains. "I use the best materials, work with master ceramists, and take time to explain options so they can make informed decisions."

Rita's commitment to excellence is evident in her accomplishments. In 2020, she became one of just over 400 dentists worldwide to earn accreditation from the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry—a prestigious distinction that involves a rigorous, multi-year process including clinical case submissions, a fourhour written exam, and a challenging oral board. She remains the first and only dentist in both Adams and York counties to currently hold this title. She also earned Diplomate status with the American Board of Dental Sleep Medicine, further expanding her skill set to include treating patients with obstructive sleep apnea with custom dental appliances.

"I love what I do," she says. "There's nothing like seeing a patient look in the mirror and truly love their smile after a transformation. There are tears of joy, hugs, and so much gratitude.







and even California.

Along with boating, Rita has embraced another longtime passion: fishing. "I've been fishing for as long as I can remember," she says. Whether it's on the bay, a quiet river, or out in open water, casting a line has become one of her favorite pastimes. "I absolutely love fishing," she says. "It's relaxing and exciting all at once. You never know what's on the other end of the line until you reel it in."

Her other new thrill? Driving fast cars—especially her own. Earlier this year, Rita attended the renowned Ron Fellows Corvette Driving School near Las Vegas, where she learned advanced performance techniques while tracking high-speed vehicles through the desert. Now, she puts that training to use behind the wheel of Stetson, her 2024 Corvette C8 Z51. With its powerful engine, sleek design,

Rita also gives back to the profession. She currently serves on the AACD's Accreditation Written Exam Committee and has coached fellow dentists through the process of becoming accredited themselves. Her leadership and mentorship continue to inspire others in the field.

With her sons now grown and her professional accomplishments firmly in place, Rita is making time to explore personal passions that had long taken a backseat.

For starters, she's discovered a love for boating something she grew up around but never fully experienced. "I grew up on a motorboat, but girls didn't drive back then," she says. "Then when I got married, my husband drove the boat. Later, when my sons were old enough, they took the wheel. Now, it's my turn." Rita joined

Rita lives in a peaceful Gettysburg neighborhood, where she enjoys breathtaking views from her back porch, visits from deer, cardinals, and blue jays, and quiet evenings surrounded by nature. "I travel so much now that it's not the right time for a dog," she says. "But one day, I'll have another."



Lola came to us 5 weeks after we lost our 11-year-old Maddie dog on July 4th, 2022. Maddie was Ken's four legged shadow, since being a puppy not even yet weaned from her mother, and losing her ripped his heart into pieces. Though distraught from her loss, he heard her voice telling him to pass along all the love still left for her in a rescue who needed it.

After searching Petfinder, and selecting 24 dogs, Ken had to winnow it down to one, and Lola won every round due to her origin story. Ken calls her his rescue angel, saying she rescued him far more than we rescued her.

Lola is a German Shepherd mix with Pomeranian. You can see it in her beautiful face, that's the GSD, and in her ginger flowing coat, that's the Pom. She also has the spunky attitude of most Poms as well.

Her trouble began when she was 5 weeks old, having been attacked by a large dog that shattered her bottom jaw and a broke her top jaw. She had to have her bottom jaw wired for 30 days. She didn't let it stop her one bit. She still tried to chew things she wasn't allowed to have. Since having

the wire removed Lola's tongue hangs out a bit to the left side since her cuspid there was lost in the jaw repair. Incredibly, it does not affect her in any way, she is a sloppy drinker like most every GSD with a perfectly formed jaw. Kudos to the vet who did her surgery.

Unfortunately, she was not properly socialized in her fostering period, this being demonstrated in her incessant warning barking at most everybody outside of the two of us she would meet, creating the impression of a feral junk vard dog more than a house pet. We knew this would take patience to overcome, and went to work on that with Lola from the first day home.

She's been our baby since August of 2022, and our bond has only grown more strongly as we spend as much time with her as possible, showering her with love and attention, indulging her love to being outside, and taking nightly walks around Gettysburg where she takes in the scents on her route and leaves "pee-mail" for other dogs she smells along the way.

As our bond has grown, her level of trust in us is clear in how she is much less inclined to bark defensively at house guest or others we meet on the street, and has matured into her life with us, knowing she is cared for, and loved as the little princess she is to us.

Many say with rescues that it's done in "threes". Three days, three weeks, three months, until the dog is comfortable in your home. We grew through each milestone giving her the time and love to settle, and in August we will be at three years, and KNOW Lola is home for good with us.

We wouldn't want it any other way.

The house is named in honor of Brigadier General Elon John Farnsworth, who led an ill-fated charge after the failure of Pickett's charge, claiming the lives of Farnsworth and 65 of his men.

The original part of the house was built in 1810, followed by the brick structure in 1833. The house sheltered Confederate sharpshooters during the three-day conflict, one of whom it is believed to have accidentally shot 20 year-old Mary Virginia "Jennie" Wade, the only civilian who died during the battle. More than 100 bullet holes pock the walls. Following the battle, the house served as a hospital.

Tucked away in Red Lion, Pennsylvania is an incredible community resource serving York, Lancaster, and Adams Counties - Servants. A simple name with an astonishing outreach, Servants serves residents in three contiguous counties: York, Lancaster, and Adams with services designed to provide residents with Healthy Homes, Safer Homes, and as a result, Healthier Lives.

Now celebrating its 25th Anniversary, Servants CEO, Trent Davis, says "Together we've seen the joy of older adults who can move freely in their homes after years of confinement, the relief of parents knowing their children are safe, and the renewed pride of families in their homes."

Servants is more than a home repair organization—it is a crusade of compassion, faith, and transformation. Through their work in providing critical home repairs, staff along with volunteers change lives through emotional and spiritual support to those in crisis as well.

My tour of the massive 16,000 square foot warehouse, adjacent to their offices, included lumber storage, painting supplies, flooring, and so much more at the ready to not only

change homes but more importantly, to build relationships, transform lives, provide hope, and build stronger communities!

#### **Mary's Story**

Living with and caring for her aging mother, Mary's home had become unsafe. A steep and crumbling wheelchair ramp made it difficult for her mother to get outside, the floors sagged dangerously, plumbing issues piled on stress, and she could barely manage.

That is when a team from Servants stepped in. Their mission is not just about fixing houses - it is about restoring hope. The team rebuilt the wheelchair ramp, repaired plumbing issues, and secured weakened floors. More than that, they brought care, compassion, and dignity.

"They didn't just fix things, said Mary - they saw me and ensured that I would not have to carry this situation alone anymore." Her story is one of many unfolding across York, Lancaster, and Adams Counties where aging homes and limited incomes leave too many neighbors stuck in unsafe living conditions.

#### **The Power of Partnerships**

With trusted and growing referral partnerships-including Penn Medicine, WellSpan, and UPMC-Servants also collaborates with Veterans Affairs and advocacy organizations, "lifting the dignity of homeowners", according to Todd Spahr, Director of Operations and Impact with Servants. Further, these vital relationships go a long way in keeping people out of Emergency Centers. "Volunteers and Project Managers take great pride in the work they do", according to Todd. For them, it is not just a matter of replacing stairs or a deck...it is about changing and empowering people's lives.

#### **Process for Projects**


In 2024 alone, and with a staff of only 11 and 550 volunteers, Servants made a staggering 500 repairs in





189 homes. Here is how the process works. A simple phone call from a homeowner results in a conversation with a staff member at Servants who conducts a brief phone assessment. Following this, a member of the staff visits the home to assess the need (oftentimes there are more needs than originally requested). A work plan is then developed which includes a budget for materials. staffing/volunteer requirements, and a schedule for the homeowner's approval. Currently, requests focus on the needs of homeowners in York, Lancaster, and Adams Counties. And speaking of volunteers, the youngest is 8 years old and the eldest is 83 years young!

Project managers are experienced professionals in their respective fields and oversee projects from start to finish. They rely on an algorithm to prioritize projects. 

### **Five Easy Fall Road Trips** from Gettysburg

#### Within Two Hours, Worlds Away

Sometimes the best way to appreciate home is to leave it for the day—and come back with fresh eyes (and maybe a car full of cider and antiques). Fall is the perfect season for a quick escape, and Gettysburg's location makes it easy to explore charming towns, winding backroads, and historic gems, all within two hours.

#### 1. Frederick. Marvland - 45 minutes

A short drive south brings you to this colorful, walkable city. Stroll along Carroll Creek Park, explore the shops and art galleries, and enjoy lunch at one of Frederick's farm-to-table restaurants. September and October often bring street festivals, live music, and craft fairs. Don't miss the Civil War Medicine Museum for a fascinating glimpse into medical history.

#### 2. Harpers Ferry, West Virginia - 1 hour 15 minutes

Where the Shenandoah meets the Potomac, Harpers Ferry combines natural beauty with deep history. Hike part of the Appalachian Trail, browse quaint shops, and wander the historic Lower Town. The fall foliage here is breathtaking, especially when viewed from Jefferson Rock.

#### 3. Hershey, Pennsylvania - 1 hour 20 minutes

Chocolate lovers, rejoice. Beyond Hersheypark, the town offers The Hershey Story Museum, beautiful botanical gardens, and tasting flights at the chocolate lab. In autumn, the surrounding farmland glows with harvest colors—perfect for a scenic drive before heading home with a sweet souvenir.

#### 4. Lancaster County, Pennsylvania - 1 hour 30 minutes

Rolling farmland, horse-drawn buggies, and endless farm markets make Lancaster County a feast for the senses. Stop at Central Market in downtown Lancaster for local treats, then take the backroads through Strasburg or Intercourse for handmade quilts, freshbaked pies, and roadside pumpkin stands.

For leaf-peeping and outdoor adventure, Catoctin is a must. Trails range from easy strolls to more challenging climbs, and overlooks like Chimney Rock reward you with sweeping autumn views. Pack a picnic—or warm up afterward in nearby Thurmont with a hearty diner meal.

# Fall Craft: Mason Jar Candle

#### What you'll need:

- Glass mason jar (with smooth sides all around)
- Dry leaves or artificial leaves
- Mod Podge (water-based glue/sealer)
- Sponge brush
- · Electric tealight candle
- Twine

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Use a sponge brush to cover a thin layer of Mod Podge around the outside of the mason jar where you will place the leaves.
- 2. Begin placing leaves onto the mason jar and brush Mod Podge over the leaves until the edges completely stick to the jar. Spread additional layers if needed. Let dry for a few hours.
- 3. Tie twine around the top of the jar as a finishing touch.

Place a tealight candle in the center of the mason jar and enjoy all the glowing fall colors.





Special Olympics provides yearround sports training and athletic competition in a variety of Olympictype sports for children and adults with intellectual disabilities or developmental disabilities with cognitive delays. These events provide continuing opportunities to develop physical fitness, demonstrate courage, experience joy, and participate in sharing gifts, skills, and friendship with the world.

Summer Games is one of several events where Special Olympics athletes in Pennsylvania gather to compete against other athletes from across the state. For many sports, athletes must earn their ticket to Summer Games by placing well in their division at qualifier events held in the spring. Special Olympics PA trains close to 16,000 athletes,

but only about 2,000 get to attend Summer Games. Therefore, when an athlete finds out they're able to go, the news is accompanied by excitement and celebration!

Summer Games is held at Penn State University for three days in early June each year. Competition takes place in athletics, basketball, equestrian, golf, gymnastics, softball, swimming, and tennis. Months of hard work and dedication in training are rewarded as athletes are cheered on and supported during competition by more than 750 trained coaches and 1,000 enthusiastic volunteers.

This year, Team Adams took 27 amazing athletes in athletics (track & field), basketball, swimming, and tennis. They were accompanied by 19 dedicated coaches and volunteers. For many, this is an event they look

forward to all year!

This year's journey to Happy Valley began with a 7:15 a.m. departure from Gettysburg on Thursday, June 5. Despite the early time, most of the delegation was bright-eyed and bushy-tailed in their Team Adams tie-dye shirts as they boarded the Wolf's charter bus. Andrew, one of the athletes' favorite Wolf Bus Lines drivers, greeted everyone with kind words and a friendly smile while proudly wearing the Team Adams t-shirt he was given last year! By mid-morning, the group was lugging suitcases, pillows, and sports equipment into Hastings Hall on the massive and beautiful main campus of Penn State University.

For three days, the athletes swam, threw, jumped, ran, dribbled, and



swung their rackets with strength and control. There were wins and losses. Happy tears and sad tears. Everyone put many miles on their legs as they walked about campus. In addition, the outdoor sports had to contend with rain showers. However, thanks to the availability of indoor facilities, all events were able to be held.

The athletes learned patience and flexibility in dealing with last-minute schedule changes due to weather. For a group who largely thrives on routine and set schedules, this was huge! ### **Breaking Barriers and Building Community:**

### **Stephanie Moore Brings Adaptive Sports to the Forefront**

When Stephanie Moore moved to South Central PA in 2022, she brought a bold vision for change. A lifelong athlete with an unstoppable spirit, Stephanie is on a mission to ignite the adaptive sports movement here in our community.

Originally from Maryland, Stephanie's athletic journey began in childhood, where she played alongside able-bodied peers. But by high school, her opportunities to compete were taken away—"out of fear of injury," she explains. So she stepped back from sports entirely. It wasn't until decades later, at the age of 40, that she decided to reclaim her athletic identity. What started as a quest for better health quickly turned into something bigger.

"I attended an adaptive sports fair and found out about all kinds of adaptive sports," she recalls. "I tried many—cycling, basketball, tennis, field hockey, rowing, and boxing." While boxing quickly became her passion, it was wheelchair tennis that she ultimately stuck with. "I love playing tennis and teaching others how to play," Stephanie says. And she's not just talking about playing casually—this year, she's participating in a wheelchair tennis





demonstration at none other than the U.S. Open.

But perhaps the most groundbreaking part of her journey so far came in the boxing ring. Stephanie made history in 2023 with the first-ever adaptive boxing exhibition match in the United States, followed by a second one in 2024. The sport is now on its way toward becoming a Paralympic event, thanks in part to the work of Stephanie's coach and community.

Still, her heart is set on sparking change right here in our community. "There are no adaptive sports nearby," she states bluntly. The nearest programs are hours away—in Chester County or Philadelphia. But rather than see this as a barrier, Stephanie sees opportunity. "We need coachesthose who already know the sports and how to teach them. I'm more than willing to meet with anyone interested in learning how to coach adaptively."

Stephanie currently trains at the Junior Tennis Champions Center in College Park, Maryland, where she puts in rigorous weekly sessions.

At home, she supplements her training with cardio, strength training,

and hand-eye coordination drills. It's a disciplined lifestyle that's brought confidence, purpose, and a deep connection with a network of adaptive athletes across the country. "They are the community I never knew I needed," she says.

But that community could, and should, exist here too. Stephanie dreams of launching adaptive tennis and boxing programs in our local area—two sports that are already equipped with potential facilities and coaches in the area. "Boxing is one of the oldest Olympic sports. There's no reason it shouldn't be a Paralympic sport too. And I believe South Central PA could help lead the charge."

Stephanie has a clear message for

anyone hesitant to try adaptive sports: "If I can start over at 40, anyone can. Development takes time. Just get in there and do your best."

Her ultimate hope? That our community will step up and embrace adaptive athletics—not just as a feelgood initiative, but as an essential, inclusive part of our local sports culture. "Get behind this endeavor." she urges. "There are athletes here who would benefit. We just need to get it started."

Continuing in its 75th Anniversary Year, the Totem Pole Playhouse located in Fayetteville, Pennsylvania once again delivered an outstanding performance this summer. With a cast of only four extremely talented actors, their performances included 100 different characters! The 39 Steps continued the Playhouse's tradition of excellence for a total of 12 performances that ran through July 27.

Based on a novel by John Buchan and a classic film by Alfred Hitchcock, the original The 39 Steps film was released in 1915. Later, Hitchcock's film of the same title was released in 1935. Today, there is even a fictional, digital adaptation called The 21 Steps as well as a TV adaptation -- each demonstrating the timelessness of this infamous story.

The background set was simple. However, amazingly quick and oftentimes humorous set enhancements, leveraged by the actors on stage, seamlessly transformed the mood. 
